## About Our In-School Programming

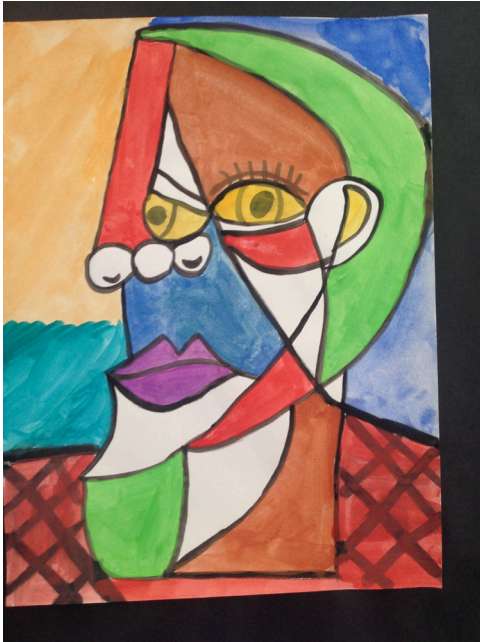
Wingspan Arts' in-school programs are custom designed to meet the needs of each school partner, offering arts learning during the school day.

Our hope is that when we collaborate with a school, we become a true arts partner and a lasting member of that school's community.

Our goal is that teaching artists make an impact on the overall curriculum: arts learning will be driven by the teaching artists during their class times and reinforced during the week by the school community. Our teaching artists often return to the same schools year after year, deepening the relationship with the school community.

### Sample Classes

- **Social Studies/Drama Integration Program:** This program utilizes drama as a tool for enhancing the social studies classes of elementary school students. Over the school year, the teaching artist meets weekly with the students to teach theatre fundamentals including acting and playwriting. The first semester's performance is a sharing of student-written monologues, and the second semester performance is a play, based on their social studies curriculum, written and performed by the class.
- **Dance Residency:** Meeting three times a week, K-5 students work with a teaching artist to build foundational dance skills, working toward a final performance for the community.
- **Pop Choir Residency:** Students learn technique and explore music fundamentals while singing songs from today's Top Ten, and writing their own music. Students develop their collaboration skills by singing in ensembles and writing songs together, culminating in a final performance.
