

About Wingspan

Wingspan Arts is a non-profit organization that is fully insured and professionally managed. We hold our programs ON-SITE at PS 110, and work in partnership with PS 110 to offer semester-long afterschool arts enrichment classes that meet once a week. The program is staffed by Site Director(s), Site Assistant(s), and professional Teaching Artists.

A Day at Wingspan Arts

- When students are dismissed from school, they are escorted to Wingspan’s central meeting area at PS 110.
- Students are provided with a snack and an option of arts based activities from school dismissal until 3:15 PM
- Arts enrichment classes run for 90 minutes from 3:15 - 4:45 PM.
- Pick-up runs from 4:45 - 6:00 PM; students again participate in a choice of arts based activities, other supervised games, or homework.
- Pick-up ends promptly at 6:00 PM; a fee of \$1/minute will be charged for any students remaining after 6 PM; fee increases after third late pick-up. **Consistent early pick-ups (before 4:45 PM) will not be accommodated.*

Tax Information

Our afterschool programs may be claimed as a childcare expense on your taxes, or used with a flex spending account! Our Federal Tax ID is 13-4189808, and our office can provide you with a formal receipt.

Financial Aid

Wingspan Arts has a long tradition of providing need-based financial aid to our incredible afterschool communities. We do our best to ensure that every child has access to the arts, regardless of their ability to pay the full tuition for our programs. Refund Policy

- If your child is not satisfied with his/her afterschool class, and withdraws within the first two weeks, we offer a full credit to your Wingspan Arts account to be used for a future class or Half-Day program.
- After the first two weeks, we offer a pro-rated credit amount to your Wingspan Arts account.
- If you wish instead to be refunded to your credit card, Wingspan Arts charges a \$50 refund fee.

Class Descriptions

MONDAY

Grades Pre-K & K – Jr. Asphalt Jungle

This energetic class will be having tons of fun in the schoolyard. Students will play four square, stickball, chalk games, and many more as they explore themes of teamwork and sportsmanship. Building skills in hand-eye coordination, balance, and trust, students will enjoy games that challenge and engage them in a fun and safe way. They are bound to have a “ball” on the playground!

Grades K-1 – Actor’s Toolkit

In Actor’s Toolkit, students will build their skills in imaginative storytelling and improvisation. Through theatre games and ensemble-building exercises, the actors in this class will learn about character development, plot structure, and scene study. Students will use their actor tools of body, voice, and imagination to tell stories in a creative and expressive way. The actors will develop their emotional awareness and social skills, while also building their toolkit to become great performers!

Grades 1-3 – Mad Science *\$60 Materials Fee

Explore the natural world and its adaptations. Observe creepy crawly bugs, make casts of animal tracks & study the feeding habits of owls as we dissect their lunch’s remains. Some of the weekly topics in this session are: Bugs, Earthworks, Walloping Weather, Mission Nutrition, All about Animals, Life in the Sea, The Birds & the Beasts, Earth Awareness, Nature and The Science of Sport!

Grades 2-5 – Modern Music

Through songs, games and exercises, students will explore the fundamentals of music and composition. Dynamics, tempo, pitch, melody, beat and rhythm will be the focus of this exciting music composition class. The musicians will learn about different instruments and develop skills in songwriting while looking at popular songs in modern day music. Students will learn singing techniques, build their knowledge of music theory and terminology, and create their own sounds in Modern Music.

TUESDAY

Grades Pre-K & K – Movin' & Groovin'

This high-energy class combines rhythm and dance to get everyone movin' to the beat! Students will explore different dance and movement styles through a wide-range of fun music, imaginative games, and exercises. Students will focus on balance, rhythm, and technique on their creative search to find new ways to move to the groove!

Grades K-1 – Lego Masters *\$15 Materials Fee

Learn how to become Lego-smart! This class will introduce teamwork, observation, creative thinking, and problem-solving skills all through the fun of Legos. Students will build towns, spaceships, bridges, railroads, artwork, and a whole lot more in this exciting class!

Grades 1-3 – Dance Evolution

From Scott Joplin's ragtime at the turn of the century to flappers in the Roarin' 20s; from Glenn Miller and the Big Band Swing to the Twist and Mashed Potato; from the 70s Hustle to Hip Hop and Funk, students will explore the growth of dance and music over the past century in America. With a focus on multiple dance styles and eras, students will both experience and research how music and dance have changed over time, as well as the effect these arts have had on American culture. The semester will end in a choreographed piece celebrating the history of dance!

Grades 2-5 – Art of Science * \$15 Materials Fee

In Art of Science, students explore science creatively by using their right brain and all of their senses. They'll taste the periodic table and discover the science of music. Students will explore the solar system, space, and even dinosaurs through dance, theatre games, and puppetry. They will paint, color, and craft experiments that help them understand friction, force, chemical reactions, and so much more! This class is perfect for the creative and the curious.

WEDNESDAY

Grades Pre-K & K – Artist Books

Students can now visualize their name on the spine or cover of a collectible handmade artist book. In this class, students will use tactile materials and a wide-array of artistic processes to create their own artistic works. With a double emphasis on literacy and visual arts, students will see the beauty in books and create their own. Students become authors and illustrators as they work on cover design, book binding, and creative stories.

Grades K-1 – Global Dance

In this class, dancers will learn styles such as African, jazz, ballet, salsa, Afro-Caribbean, Indian, hip hop, funk and swing. They will dance to music from all over the world and participate in games and exercises that will help them listen to the sounds that make each style and culture unique. This class encourages an awareness and appreciation of other countries' historical dance styles and inspires students to find a common colorful thread that runs through ALL movement.

Grades 1-3 – Myths & Legends

Storytellers in this class will bring Myths & Legends from around the world to life! In this class, students will use skills in literacy, teamwork, and creative thinking to devise staged versions of familiar stories. The Gods of Mount Olympus, Native American Folktales, and stories pertaining to the origin of Greek, Roman, and Egyptian mythology will serve as the foundation of this class. Students will use acting techniques and their curious imaginations to stage an adaptation of a timeless story!

Grades 2-5 – Printmaking

This class is an introduction to the fun of printmaking! Students will learn a variety of printmaking activities, which may include potato stamps, relief printing, and silk screening. Their designs will come to life on paper, cloth, and more!

THURSDAY

Grades Pre-K & K – Puppets & Play

Puppeteers will design, build, and activate their puppets in this hands-on and creative class. This class will give students a chance to research the mechanics and engineering of puppet design, while also using their imaginations to create new characters! Students will build puppets from lollipops, styrofoam balls, vegetables and fruit, and pop-up paper, and then bring them to life through acting exercises and techniques. The class culminates in a puppetry performance at the end of the semester!

Grades K-1 – Painter's Palette

Create sketch drawings and turn them into beautiful paintings using a variety of paints and canvases! Learn how to use color and value to create light, shadows, and form. Explore composition, color mixing, painting techniques, and self-expression in this fun class!

Grades 1-3 – Music Makers

Through songs, games, and exercises, students will learn the fundamentals of music. Students will explore dynamics, tempo, pitch, melody, beat, and rhythm - all while learning to sing and play their favorite songs. Musicians in this class will write and perform songs while gaining a basic knowledge of music theory and vocabulary.

Grades 2-5 – Sketch Comedy

Writers, comedians, and performers will master the art of funny in the Sketch Comedy class. Through writing exercises, improv games, and acting techniques, students will learn the fundamentals of comedy in performance. Students will create characters, conflicts, and circumstances that put the FUN in FUNNY! This class will culminate in a series of written sketches to be performed in front of a live audience!

FRIDAY

Grades Pre-K & K – Mini Mozart

In this class, we will explore classical music! We will listen to compositions from a variety of composers and learn about the history behind the piece. Through songs, games, and exercises, we'll explore the fundamentals of music. We'll learn about dynamics, tempo, pitch, melody, beat and rhythm. In the course of our time together we will write our own songs and leave with a core understanding of musical vocabulary.

Grades K-1 – 3D Artists

Let's build! This class is a 3D visual arts class with an emphasis on creativity, fun, and invention! Students will learn sculpture methods using clay, foam, wire, and more. Through pottery, ceramics, statues, and abstract sculpture - students will learn the different techniques necessary to become a true 3D Artist.

Grades 1-3 – Backyard Sports

Four square, handball, tag games, stickball... If you can play it in the backyard, students will play it here! This high-energy class brings everyone's favorite games together, from traditional sports like soccer and wiffle ball, to more unique games like ga-ga and obstacle courses. Backyard Sports introduces students to games that will teach both friendly cooperation *and* healthy competition.

Grade 2-5 Hip Hop

With a combination of old school and new school hip hop, dancers will learn cutting edge street dance movements. Students will pop, lock, jam, and break while also working together to create dynamic dance pieces. Balancing challenging choreography with the students' own creative influence, this class will result in an exciting dance performance.
